Arthur Bugden



Arthur William Chesley Bugden, the son of Gilbert Bugden and Elizabeth Ann Batson was born in English Harbour in August 1914. Arthur joined the 57th Squadron of the Royal Air Force in WW II. He rose to the rank of Pilot Officer and Flight Engineer. His Lancaster bomber was shot down over Denmark on May 22nd, 1944. He was 29.

Arthur married Phyllis Penny sometime after the 1935 census. Lieutenant Bugden, along with six other airmen, took off from RAF East Kirkby, England on a night mine laying mission over the Baltic Sea. The Lancaster was attacked and shot down by a German night fighter plane near the village of Emtekaer, Denmark. There were no survivors. They were all buried in Assens (Fyn) New Cemetery, Assens, Denmark.
