The Trinity Benefit Club 1838 - 2022

The Trinity Benefit Club was formed in February 1838, at a meeting held in the old Court House at Trinity by Reverend William Bullock, incumbent of Trinity Mission, and other members of the town. At the first meeting, 76 people were enrolled in the Club, officers were elected and Rev. Bullock became the first President.

The purpose of the Club was to provide relief and assistance to members and families in case of sickness and death. The Club received its present name in 1846, being previously known as the Trinity Club and the Independence Club. The Club was non-denominational and was at the essence of Brotherhood.

The Club flag which, was probably designed by Rev. William Bullock, depicts the shamrock, thistle and rose joined in unity. Membership in the Club was open to male residents within the ages of 15 and up from English Harbour to British Harbour. The Club continues to meet twice a year on Candlemas Day and All Saints Day.

In 2010 on Candlemas Day, women from the Board of Directors and Executive Staff of Newfoundland and Labrador Workplace Health Safety and Compensation Commission were at the meeting along with Hon Ross Wiseman MHA for Trinity North Minister of Business Development at that time. This was the first time women were recorded as being at the meetings.

The Club was the first to be similar to an early form of Worker's Compensation. The Club is now 184 years old and has had only 19 Presidents. The longest position of President was held for 40 years. It maintains a Healthy Financial record and a strong membership.

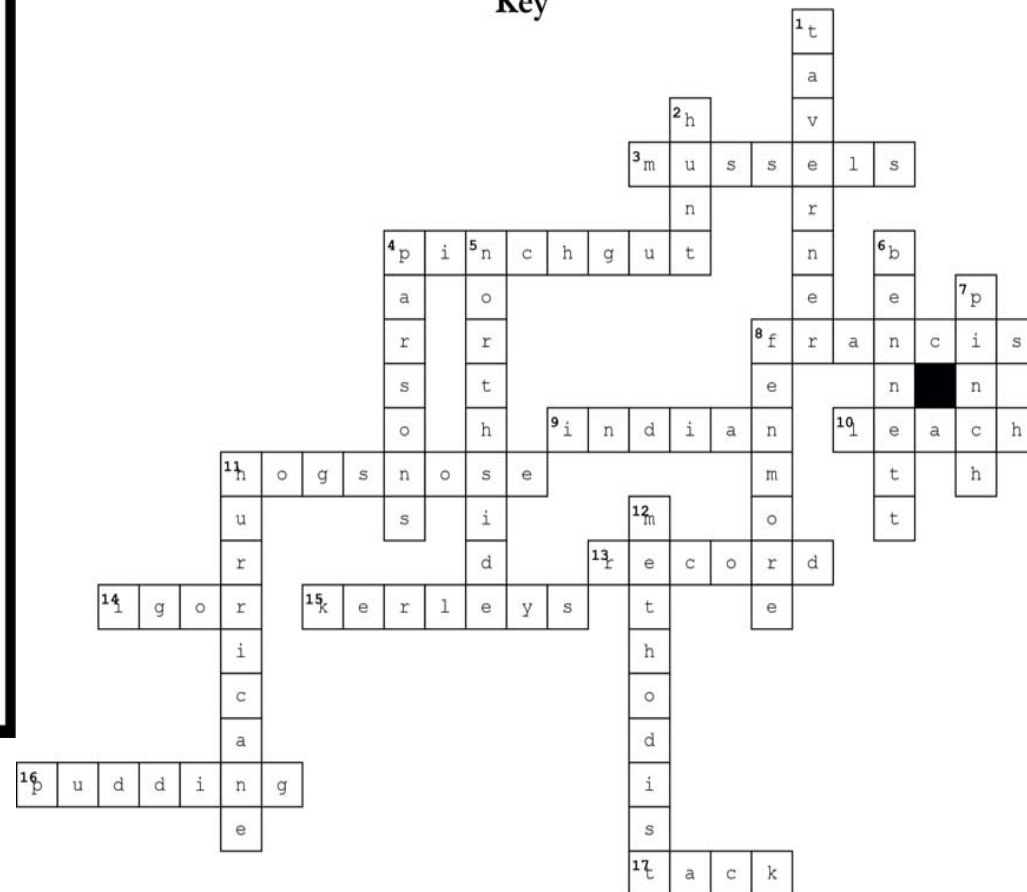

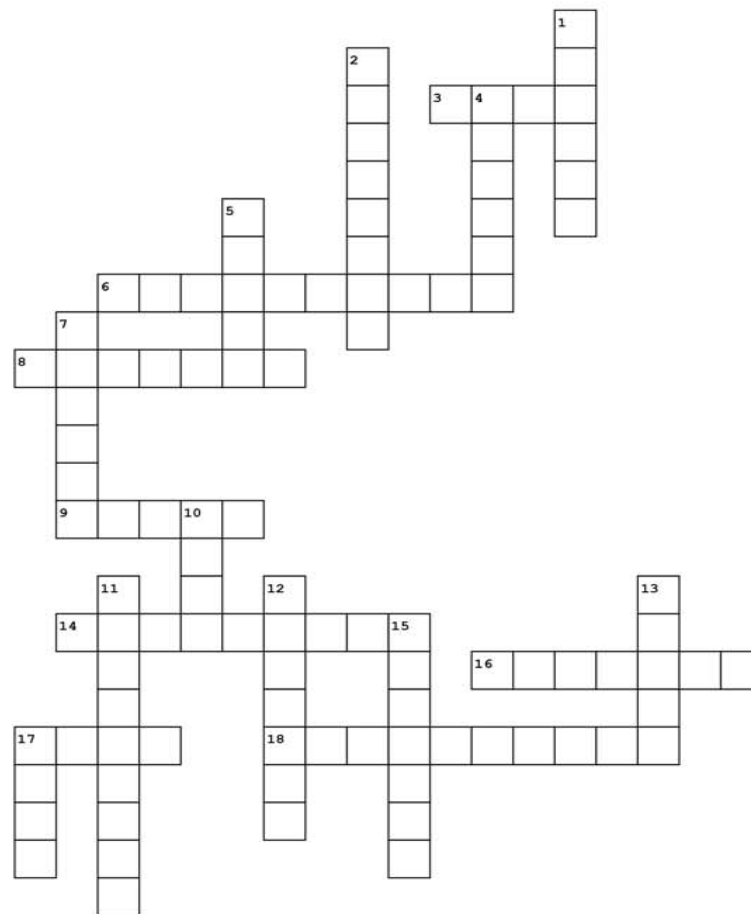

As always, the THS welcomes application for membership from anyone interested in the objectives and activities of the Society.

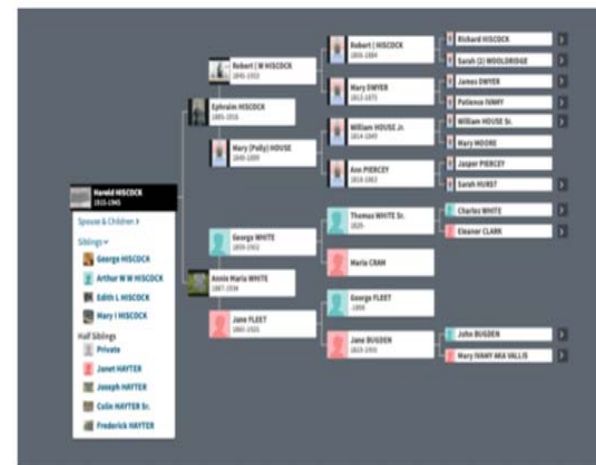
In this edition of our Newsletter, we present the story of the 14th of the men whose names are inscribed on the War Monument in St. Paul's Churchyard.



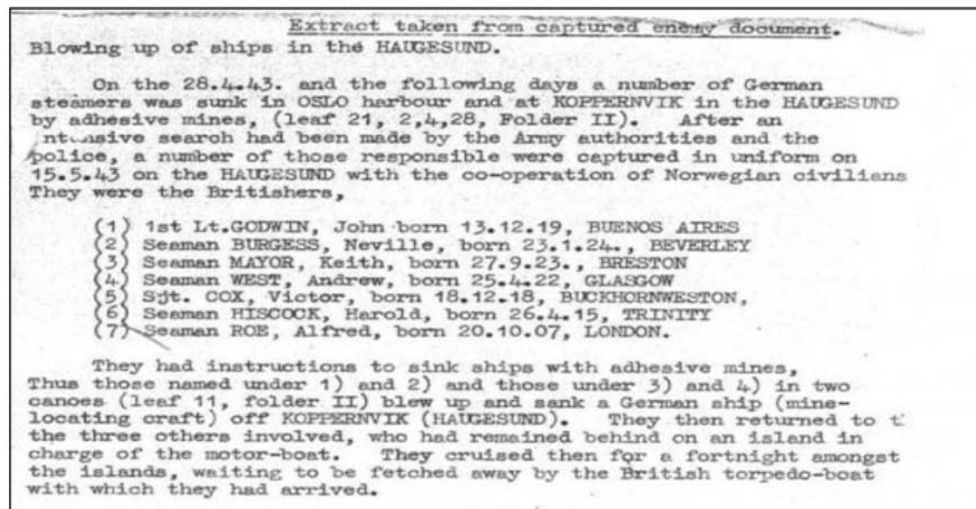
Harold Hiscock



Harold Hiscock, the son of Ephraim Hiscock and Annie Maria White, was born in Trinity on April 26, 1915. He enlisted in the Royal Navy in WW II and was placed in the Royal Navy Patrol Service. Petty Officer Hiscock joined the 14 Commando Unit in December of 1942 and took part in Operation Checkmate. He was captured and interred at Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp where he was executed on February 2, 1945. He was 29.



Operation Checkmate was a combined operations raid on Axis shipping in the harbour at Kopervik, Norway. This raid was a No 14 Commando operation. The raiders managed to sink several ships using limpet mines, but were eventually captured and initially taken to Haugesund for interrogation before being transported to Sachsenhausen Concentration Camp. All but one of the group were executed whilst Prisoners of War.
