

- be graduating from Level III in June 2023 and planning to pursue an education at a post-secondary institution in September 2023.



#### **ELIZABETH RIXON, CARNELL, (BESS) GREEN**



In addition to the stories of men who have left their mark in Trinity lore there are stories of women whose adventures are worthy of notice. One such story is that of Bess Green. Bess was born in Trinity on April 3, 1891, the eldest child of John and Mary Ann Green. The Green Family Forge, still operational today, was the bastion of the males of the family for generations. Perhaps that is why Bess struck out early to make her mark in life. She was schooled in Trinity and left home to live in Boston as a young woman where she studied to become a nurse. Records show she was living in Roxbury, Massachusetts when WWI broke out. The United States did not enter the fray until 1917. Bess's three younger brothers, young men living in Trinity, all left for St. John's to enlist in the Newfoundland Regiment. Cecil (B. 1896) enlisted in the British Army, Harvey (B. 1899) enlisted in the Royal Navy, while Andrew (B. 1893) was not accepted for service due to a leg injury. Andrew returned to Trinity and eventually took over the family forge business.

Bess found her way to the Women's Army Corps Training Center in Fort Oglethorpe, Georgia, USA. From there she enlisted in the U.S. Army Nurse Corps and was assigned to active service on April 10, 1918. She was sent to the Nurse's Mobilization Station in New York and departed for Europe on June 25, 1918. She served as a nurse at a hospital in Savenay, in the Brittany region of western France, until June of 1919, eight months after the armistice was signed. She was ordered to embark for New York on the S.S. Rotterdam on June 30, 1919. At the Nurses' demobilization Center in the Hotel Albert, she received all \$122.53 of her back pay that was due and was relieved of active duty on July 22, 1919. It is interesting to note, considering the current pandemic, that Bess's re-entry into the U.S. required details of her three courses of Typhoid vaccination and one Smallpox vaccination.

Bess returned from the war to live in Boston with her life-long partner Mary P. Allison, but Bess's war was not yet over. Her brothers - Cecil and Harvey - survived WWI. Cecil stayed in England, married, and raised his family there.

Harvey, who survived the sinking of the warship he served on during the war, continued to work as a sailor out of Boston. He is listed as a lodger at Mary Allison's mother's home. When WWII broke out in 1939 Harvey joined the merchant marine. Because he listed his sister, Elizabeth (Bess) Green as his next of kin, Bess received the following telegram:

March 12, 1942

Miss E.R.C. Green 147 Kent Street Brookline, Mass.

Dear Miss Green:

Mr. Harvey Green, who appears on the crew list of the S.S. Major Wheeler, has indicated that advises of any nature be sent to you. It is with great regret, therefore, that it becomes our duty to notify you that we have received the following from Admiral E.S. Land, Administrator, War Shipping Administration, Washington D.C.:

"It is with regret that you are informed that this vessel is overdue and presumed lost by enemy action. According to our records vessel sailed from Fajardo, February 3rd, bound Philadelphia, and Navy Department states that no message whatever had been received or intercepted that would indicate a distress signal. The Navy further says there has been no report received by them of the vessel's arrival at any port or place and that no wreckage has been found. It is further stated by the Navy, no unusual weather conditions prevailed that would indicate loss by heavy weather. Under the circumstances you are requested to notify the next of kin of the members of the crew of this unfortunate matter."

Bess and Mary Allison returned to Trinity and stayed at the family home behind the Forge for many summers. Elizabeth R.C. Green passed away in 1987 at the age of 96 followed by Mary Allison in 1989 at the age of 97. In accordance with Bess's wishes her and Mary's ashes are buried together in the Green Family plot next to the headstone in memory of Harvey.

# Richard Miller Short





Richard, the son of William Short and Annie Rowe, was born at New Bonaventure on June 15th, 1896. He enlisted in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment on March 8th, 1915. He was declared missing in action at Beaumont-Hamel on July 1st, 1916. He was 20.

Richard, a teacher before joining the regiment, was part of the first action at Gallipoli. After evacuation from Gallipoli the regiment disembarked at Marseille, France on March 22<sup>nd</sup>, 1916 to join the fighting there. He was one of the 801 young men who went "over the top" at Beaumont-Hamel on the morning of July 1st, 1916. Only 68 answered the call the next morning. Private Short was first listed as wounded but was later declared missing in action. His remains were never recovered. He is remembered on the Beaumont Hamel Memorial, Beaumont Hamel, France.
