The Trinity Historical Society (THS) is pleased to report that Robyn Lacy and Ian Petty from Black Cat Cemetery Preservation completed a third week of work on the restoration of the headstones in St. Paul's Churchyard June 20-24th. During this time, they up righted, reset, repaired, and cleaned an additional 52 headstones. Once again, we would like to thank Corey Jones for providing accommodation for them at Trinity Cabins. A total of 127 headstones have now been restored. The cost for Black Cat to perform this third week of work was \$9,951.16, in addition to the cost of two loads of crusher dust which we supplied on site. Further work to complete the restoration of the remaining headstones will depend on our ability to raise additional funds for the project.

The book launch of "From Fisher's Cove, Trinity. Poetry and Prose by siblings Rose Sullivan and George Hoskins" was scheduled for July 19th, at the Lester Garland House with readings by Ruth Lawrence and Des Walsh but had to cancelled due to covid exposure and will be rescheduled. The book is available for purchase at the Lester Garland Giftshop.

As always, the THS welcomes application for membership from anyone interested in the objectives and activities of the Society.

Arthur Hurdle



Arthur William Hurdle, the son of Charles Hurdle and Jessie Verge, was born in Cuckholds Cove on June 20, 1895. He enlisted in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment at the Church Lads Brigade Armoury in St. John's on February 8, 1915. He was killed in action at the Battle of Cambrai, France, on November 21, 1917. He was 22.



Family Tree

At enlistment Arthur recorded his occupation as fisherman earning \$300.00 per year. He was 5' 8 1/4" tall and weighed 147 lbs. He had a dark complexion, black hair and blue eyes. He embarked St. John's for Liverpool with No. 8 Platoon of D Company on March 20, 1915. After training in Scotland, he embarked for Egypt on August 20, arriving on August 31. He then embarked for Gallipoli, landing at Suvla Bay on the night of September 19-20. He was evacuated with medical illness in December and rejoined the regiment at Alexandria on January 16, 1916. On March 16 he embarked Port Suez for France and the western front. He was invalided to England with medical illness on June 6 and subsequently was assigned to the Regimental depot at Ayr.

On August 5, 1917 he landed at Rouen with the 28th Reinforcement Draft, went to Belgium and then to northern France in October. In November, the Newfoundland Regiment fought in the Battle of Cambrai as a part of the 29th Division of the British Army. On November 21, while serving with the reinforcement detachment during fighting near the villages of Marcoing and Masnieres, Pte. Hurdle was wounded and taken to the 48th Casualty Clearing Station, where he died of his wounds that same day. He is buried at Rocquigny-Equancourt Road British Cemetery, Manancourt, France

At Sea of Whales Adventures, we continue to observe, photograph, and track the migration patterns of humpback whales that visit Trinity and Bonavista Bay. Collecting data on location, social groups, behaviour, and new calves, allows Sea of Whales Adventures to continue to contribute to international research on humpback whales and several other species. Observing these animals in their natural habitat, tracking where they have been throughout their migration, and networking with other research groups along the way allows us a deeper understanding of what is happening with this population.

Humpback whales are the real summer showstoppers in Trinity Bay! These animals are known for their energetic displays of lunge feeding, spy hopping, flipper slapping, tail lobbing, and breaching. Similar to other baleen whale species, humpback whales are not part of the highly developed social structures that are seen in toothed whales. The toothed whales, Orcas and sperm whales, live in family groups for their entire lives. However, baleen whales are often solitary, forming small groups on feeding grounds and breeding grounds, and these groups are often competing for mates. The sweetest pairs that are seen together, are mothers with their calves. On the feeding grounds here in Newfoundland, the groups that form are highly variable and the animals often group and regroup over the season. However, we at Sea of Whales Adventures, have observed on occasion the same animals feeding together in the same area at around the same time year after year.

It is estimated that these animals can live to be 70-80 years of age. However, identification research has only been done since the mid 1970's so the oldest whales can only be dated back to that time. The earliest whales photographed here were in 1974, making them at minimum, 48 years old. As identification and research continues, we will have higher accuracy when aging whales.

Humpback whales have one of the longest migrations of any mammal on the planet, averaging 1600 km from the breeding grounds to feeding grounds. Several of the whales that we have photographed in the waters around Trinity have had significantly longer migrations. Female humpback NA #6510 was photographed both in Trinity and Franz Josef Land Russia, a distance of 4300 km! Humpback NA #04773 was sighted in both Trinity Bay and the Azores, 2500 km away! Why these individuals have travelled so far out of what would be considered "normal" humpback migratory patterns is still unknown.

Humpbacks breed in the Caribbean and feed in the rich waters of the North Atlantic. While pregnant, females swim all the way to their northern feeding grounds, travel south to calve and then swim back to the feeding grounds again. These moms must build up enough fat stores on the northern feeding grounds while pregnant to sustain them and their calves until they return almost a year later to feed again. Humpbacks give birth to one calf every 2-3 years. This calf will weigh 1-2 tonnes at birth and measure 10-15 feet long. Humpback milk is approximately 50% fat and is the consistency of cottage cheese. It is estimated that a humpback calf can gain up to 100 pounds and grow one inch each day.

Born out of necessity and developed into a true art form mat making or rug hooking is an integral part of heritage of Newfoundland and Labrador. Connected by Tradition is an exhibition featuring works of textile artists Winnie Glavine and Anastasia Tiller.

Having diverse backgrounds these two artists, residing in Newfoundland and Labrador, were connected through their love for rug hooking. In this exhibition each artist brings their own perspective and technique to the view of the audience.

Anastasia and Winnie have a history of participating in a variety of craft related fairs and gatherings. Their collaboration entry to Rug Hooking Guild of Newfoundland and Labrador 25th Anniversary Celebration Contest was one of the three winners in 2021. This homonymous rug is a culmination of their collaboration and is a centerpiece for this exhibition.

Anastasia is a multidisciplinary artist working with variety of mediums to interpret the world around her into pictorial space. She works from her studio by the sea in beautiful Lethbridge on the Bonavista Peninsula. She responds to the world emotionally. This poetic, mystical and fantasy driven approach is reflected in her work. Her artistic journey is an exploration.

Using rug hooking as her medium, Winnie is inspired by life around her in a realistic and traditional manner, drawing on past memories, Newfoundland culture and nature as she sees it. Based in Paradise, her work is created in stolen moments of a busy family life and teaching rug hooking workshops both in person and through social media.



Trinity Residents Launch Three Little Free Libraries

When Hurricane Igor struck Newfoundland in 2010, it damaged Trinity Town Hall, which also housed the town library. The Town Hall moved to a temporary location and the books that could be salvaged from the library were packed up for future use. In the fall of 2019, the town held a book sale and even after that multi-day event, some books remained. Some were sent to other local charities for fundraising purposes (local hospital in Clarenville), the school at Bishop White in Port Rexton took most of the children's book, and others were donated to good will causes. Michele DuRand, owner and operator of Rosewood Suites Trinity, approached the Town and asked them to donate some of the leftover books to help stock Little Free Libraries (LFLs) in Trinity. The Town agreed and Michele enlisted two other Trinity residents to build and host LFLs. Michele, with construction help from Glen Vokey, is hosting a library in front of her heritage property Rosewood Suites. The Hunt family - Darren, Jill, and daughter Jaiden (with construction assistance from Chris King) – have a library near the playground in the center of town and it is stocked with children's books. And Ian Morris and Brenda O'Brien built a LFL which is located near the new Trinity Town Hall (formerly the Parish Hall).

Michele DuRand grew up in Baltimore, Maryland and she and her sister operated a lending library from their basement, so that other kids in the neighbourhood could borrow books. She wanted to organize Little Free Libraries in Trinity to "help bring books to rural areas and make them more accessible for all." Jaiden Hunt organized a yard sale in the summer of 2019 to sell some of her toys to raise money to help upgrade the Trinity playground equipment, where she and her friends enjoyed spending time. The sale had an amazing turnout, many people paid several times what items were worth, and some people who could not attend in person even sent donations. Jaiden says she is "very thankful for the support of my friends and neighbours, and I'm very happy to be part of the addition of a Little Free Library to the playground!"

The idea was to launch all three LFLs in the summer of 2020 and the structures were designed by each group and approved by the town in February 2020. Unfortunately, the COVID pandemic arrived and the launch was postponed for a couple years. Now the libraries have been built and all three were launched on Saturday, July 23rd. They are now open for business and all are officially registered and mapped on the Little Free Library site (https://www.littlefreelibrary.org/)! If anyone has books they would like to contribute, please contact Michele (trinitynewfoundland@gmail.com) to arrange for pickup.
