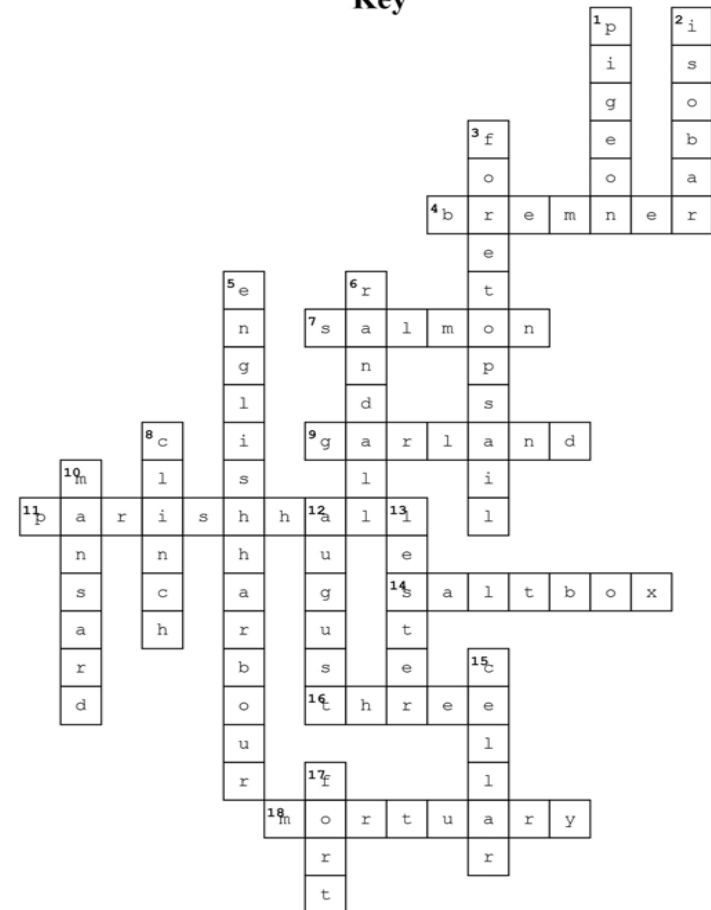

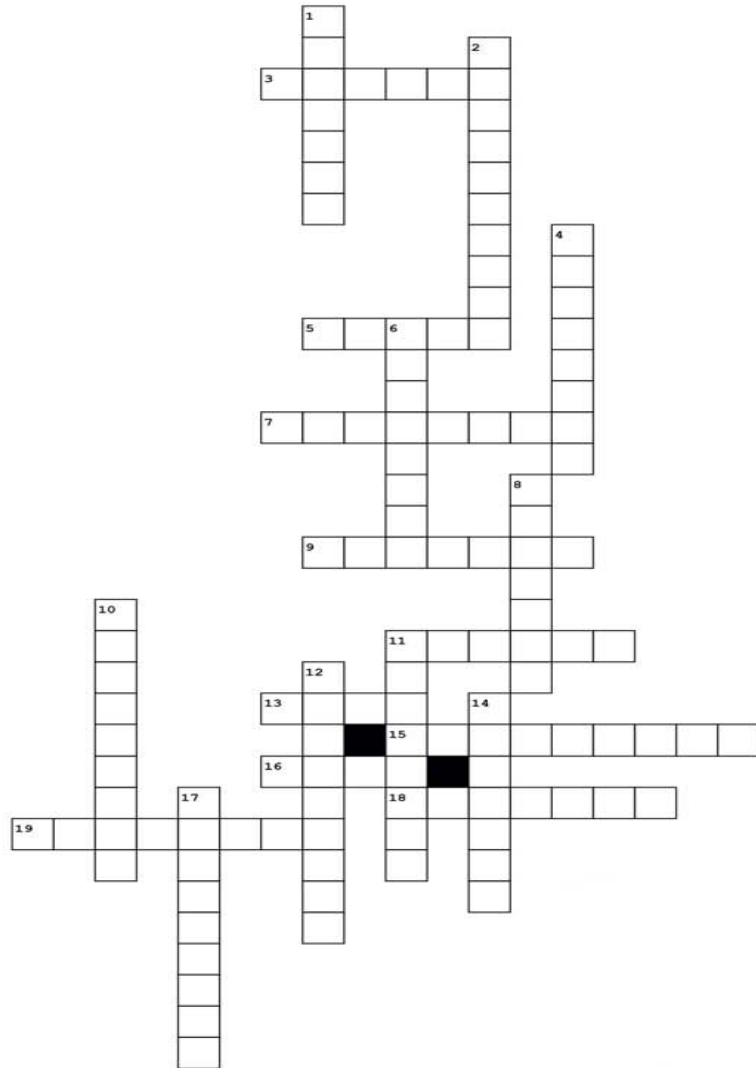

Private William Clark, a fisherman before enlisting, joined the regiment in France on November 7th, 1916 and on April 14th, 1917 took part in Battle of Arras at Monchy Le Preux. The day proved to be the most costly day of the war for the regiment which suffered 487 casualties.

“Private Clark was reported as...*missing in action*...on April 14th, 1917, while serving with ‘A’ Company in the fighting at Monchy-le-Preux. Some thirty weeks later, on November 17th, 1917, he was officially...*presumed dead*.”

His remains were never recovered. He is remembered on the Beaumont Hamel Memorial, Beaumont Hamel, France.

Orcas

Sea of Whales Adventures

August 2023

With their distinctive black and white colouring and tall dorsal fins, Orcas are among the most easily recognized whales. We hear so much about the Orcas of the Pacific Northwest and lately, about what had been happening with Orcas off the coast of Spain. Many visitors are shocked to hear that we have Orcas in our waters. They are, in fact, one of the most widely distributed whales worldwide.

Orcas can range from 15 – 30 feet in length. They are the largest of all the dolphins. These whales tend to live in very highly developed social groups. Males and females will stay with their family for their entire lives. As with other dolphin species, family groups will join together to form super pods during breeding time so that males and females are breeding with individuals that they are not closely related to.

In the Pacific Northwest, the resident Orcas have been studied extensively and are perhaps the most well-known group of whales in the world. There are resident, fish eating pods and transient pods that feed on fish and mammals. The most well known are the resident pods as they spend more time closer to shore making it easier to be seen. Researchers can even tell which group they are listening to on recordings as each pod has a different dialect.

In this region, research on this species is fairly new and there is certainly a lot to learn. The Orcas that frequent the waters around Newfoundland are more like the transient whales on Canada's west coast. They feed on both fish and mammals. There have been many reports of Orcas predating on minke whales and the calves of larger species here over the years. For now, it does not appear that these whales have a regular pattern that they follow and sightings around the Bonavista peninsula are sporadic, occurring anywhere from June – November. There may be Orcas in our waters outside of this time period as well but not as many eyes on the water to report the sightings as there are in the warmer months.

Kris Prince has been documenting Orca whales in our waters since the late 1990's and continued to do so when he started Sea of Whales Adventures. To identify individuals, the eye patch, saddle patch and the shape of the dorsal fin must be documented. The eye patch is the white spot just behind the eye. The saddle patch is a light grey patch behind the dorsal fin that has a distinct shape. Scars are also present on many of the whales making them easier to identify. Matching these animals is often tricky particularly with the females. The groups are often most recognizable by the adult males that are in the group. The males have a dorsal fin that can grow up to 6 feet high in adults that often has a distinct shape.

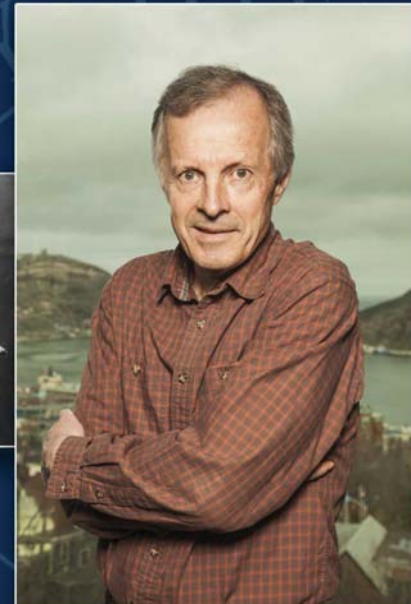
In July of 2021, there was a male in our area whose dorsal fin had completely fallen over. For this individual, the fin sits at a 90-degree angle to the top of his back. This was the first time that this had been seen in our area. This is a phenomenon that is often observed in captive Orcas and assumed to be the result of not enough time spent below the surface of the water as their tanks are typically not very deep. The support that the fin gets when below the water is significantly reduced in captivity and can

result in a floppy dorsal fin. The large male Orca that was spotted was not captive and seemed to be otherwise healthy. It has been speculated that the collapse could have been as a result of breaching on another whale whether in competition for a mate or during a hunt. It is also possible that this male is quite old and his dorsal fin is just not as strong as it once was. Whatever the reason for the collapse, it makes this animal and his family easy to identify. Interestingly he was spotted just last week off the coast of St Pierre and Miquelon!

Arlene Erven started compiling the catalogue of Newfoundland and Labrador Orcas and is still working away at it. It is a lot of work to compile the hundreds of photos and videos that she receives each year. There are about 170 Orcas in the catalogue there are several photos that are not clear enough to make an ID. More than half of these were contributed by Sea of Whales Adventures' Kris Prince and Reg Kempen. There are 20 of the Orcas who have appeared in both the St Pierre and Newfoundland catalogues. Many of the whales that have been spotted around the Bonavista peninsula by Sea of Whales Adventures over the years have been spotted around the island and in Labrador. Sea of Whales and Arlene have recently been granted access to an Arctic Orca catalogue. It is hoped that there will one day be matches across a wider area.
