

# Crinity Historical Society Adopt a Headstone Project Update


The Trinity Historical Society (THS) is pleased to report that Robyn Lacy and Ian Petty from Black Cat Cemetery Preservation completed their fourth week of work on the restoration of the headstones in the churchyard at St. Paul's on October 7th, 2022. They have now reset, repaired and cleaned a total of 151 headstones in the yard, which includes all of those which needed to be up-righted and repaired. This is about one headstone per hour of work. The remaining stones do not need to be up-righted or repaired but do need to be cleaned. During their fourth week in Trinity, they also restored 6 headstones in the old Methodist Cemetery on High Street which were in urgent need of restoration. Robyn and Ian are both archeologists and are experts in cemetery preservation. We are very pleased with their work. They have taught us much about the care of the headstones and what not to do to avoid damaging the stones.

We would like to express our sincere thanks to the many individuals who made donations to this project. Many of you who made donations are descendants of those who are in the churchyard and we appreciate being able to make contact with you. Some of you have joined the Society and we welcome your membership.

We completed the repair of the War monument and added storyboards which tell the stories of the 21 men whose names are on the monument in time for a ceremony on November 11, 2021. The storyboards were unveiled by descendants of these men at that ceremony.

The cost of the restoration and enhancement of the War Monument was \$12,661.60. We raised \$13,751.20 for the Project which was Phase I of our churchyard restoration. We applied for and received a grant from Veterans' Affairs in the amount of \$5000.00, we received a donation from the Town of Trinity in the amount of \$2,500.00, and we raised \$4,060.00 in ticket sales for Pam Sullivan's hooked rug. The remainder of the funds raised came from private donations. The \$1,089.60 in excess of Phase I costs was applied to Phase II of the restoration project. Phase II was restoration of the 50 headstones most in need of repair and Phase III included the remaining stones.

The restoration of the headstones in the churchyard was performed by Black Cat Cemetery Preservation. The cost for Black Cat to perform this work over four weeks was \$30,795.04. We incurred additional costs related to materials and transportation of \$1,508.43. Other expenses including the printing of tickets and promotional material, ticket license fee and bank fees totalled \$653.78. The cost of the initial site visit by Black Cat was \$342.24. The final report when completed will cost an additional \$258.75. Total expenses thus far have totalled \$33,299.99.





As of November 29, 2022, we have raised a total of \$34,498.75 We applied for and received a grant from Come Home 2022 in the amount of \$13,000.00. We raised \$3,700.00 on ticket sales on the painting donated by Ed Roche. Mike Murphy of Halifax won the hooked rug on tickets and he donated this back to the Society. The rug was sold at our in-person auction for \$1000.00. Masonic Union Lodge #28 donated \$500.00 and the remainder of the funds raised came from private donors. The amount remaining in the project account as of November 29, 2022 is \$1,198.76. The cost of the final report from Black Cat will be paid from this account when that invoice is received.

Black Cat Cemetery Preservation estimates that about three days of work will be required to clean the remaining headstones. Over the next few months, we hope to raise the additional funds needed to complete the project in the spring of 2023.

The success of this project depended on the efforts and contributions of numerous individuals. Once again, we would like to thank Corey Jones for providing accommodations for Ian and Robyn at Trinity Cabins free of charge for the four weeks they were in Trinity and we thank Pam Sullivan and Ed Roche for donating the beautiful hooked rug and painting for sale on tickets. We thank Ervin Locke for the donation of crusher dust used to stabilize the headstones. We thank those members of THS who helped with ticket sales and we thank Pam Sullivan and Sharon Jeans for their communications expertise. We thank THS staff members Jim Miller and Dean Bailey for their work in the organization and implementation of the Project and Kyle Hurdle for his help on site. We would again like to thank all of those who donated to the Project, those who bought tickets on the hooked rug and the painting, and the Government of NL for their support through the Come Home Year Program. The Adopt a Headstone Project would not have been possible without this considerable effort and financial support.

The churchyard looks lovely following this restoration. We believe caring for these headstones honours the memory of those who are buried there.

Further work to complete the restoration of the remaining headstones will depend on our ability to raise the additional funds required.

### Benjamin Lester and his Taverner Ancestry

Benjamin Lester (1724-1802) was son of Francis Lester. Francis was mayor of Poole in 1716 and owned at least one ship in the Newfoundland trade in the 1730s. Benjamin's mother, Rachael, was the daughter of William Taverner (1639-1693). whose family had deep roots in the Newfoundland cod fishery at Bay de Verde. Benjamin was just 13 years old when his father died in 1737 but that year went to Newfoundland, the employ of his kinsman/cousin, John Masters, an eminent Poole-Newfoundland merchant (who had married Sarah Taverner). John Masters was born in 1687/8 in Silly Cove (Winterton) Trinity Bay, raised in Poole (after his father died c.1698) and at the age of 13 years was apprenticed to William Taverner, then captain of a Newfoundland ship. This William Taverner was Benjamin Lester's uncle, his mother's brother.

Under the patronage of different members of his mother's family Benjamin was taught the workings of the transatlantic Newfoundland trade (primarily the cod fishery) from Trinity, an emerging mercantile centre dominated by Poole merchants on the northeast coast of the island. From a boy apprentice with John Masters, he progressed steadily, became a merchant (first in partnership with brother Isaac), expanded commercial operations and, by the 1780s, was the acknowledged wealthiest merchant in Poole, the most affluent and influential West Country figure in the Newfoundland trade. In testimony to a Committee of the House of Commons on the Newfoundland trade in 1793, Richard Routh, an imminent lawyer with considerable Newfoundland experience, identified the major British merchants who had earned great wealth in it. Turning to the Poole participants, his first comment was that "Mr. Lester's immense fortune is known to the public in general."

Benjamin Lester grew up in Poole and was tutored by his uncle Isaac Taverner, a 'writing master.' He enjoyed the advantages of education and literacy and was throughout his life an active writer and avid reader. In 1749 Lester married his cousin Susannah, daughter of Jacob Taverner, a prominent settler in Trinity.

Through her or, more likely, by assuming her father's huge debt to several merchant suppliers, he gained occupance and ownership of a valuable waterside property, known as Taverner's Plantation. [This property was initially granted to William Taverner in 1700 and today is occupied by buildings owned by Trinity Pageant and the Lester-Garland Premises Historic Site] On this site in the decades following Lester built a major mercantile establishment including a large Georgian brick house, a counting house, a complex of warehouses, stores, wharves and workplaces & houses for artisans, and a shipyard.

In 1749 Benjamin Lester was appointed a justice of the peace for the district of Trinity, a position he held for over twenty years. In the late 40s he was agent for Master and Ballard in supplying the Trinity garrison at Admiral's (Fort) Point. When these partners both died within a year of each other 1755/6, Benjamin acted as executor and attempted to collect debts from about 30 fisherman-planters (settler families) in Trinity Bay. By now Lester was himself a merchant as well as a substantial planter. A census taken in 1753 records him as a married "Master" with one child, employing 83 summer servants (38 English, 45 Irish), operating 11 fishing boats and skiffs, from three stages (landing structures for fish), and employing 44 winter servants (18 English, 26 Irish). These measures ranked him second in Trinity only to his Poole Quaker cousin, Joseph White, son of Samuel White and Mary Taverner of Bay de Verde, in the summer codfishery, but show him by far the largest local employer of winter servants indicating that he was much involved in wood cutting, boat building (possibly ship building), furring and sealing.

Benjamin's residency in Trinity is recorded in sundry documents (church and court records, government records and the Lester- Papers). All six of his children by Susannah [Francis 1751, Rachael 1752, John (Sir John) 1754, Susannah 1756, Amy 1759, and Sarah 1762] were born in Trinity. Francis died an infant. The others at about five or six years were sent to Poole to reside with relatives for schooling. Meanwhile Susannah remained in Newfoundland until 1767 when Sarah her youngest was five years but then she went to England to live in Poole. Benjamin went back and forth until the outbreak of the American Revolution. It was then rumoured the Americans were offering a bounty for his capture in retaliation for his support of punitive measures against the American colonies which triggered their outrage leading to the Revolutionary War (War of Independence). After 1775 Benjamin stopped coming to Newfoundland and remained in England where he became first Mayor of Poole and later a Member of

Parliament. After brother Isaac died in 1778 Ben took control of the firm and left Newfoundland operations in charge of an agent, Thomas Stone, formerly his chief clerk at Trinity.

## **Moses Dewling**



On July 31, 1918 Moses was serving as a deckhand onboard the British Navy drifter HMD City of Liverpool patrolling submarine nets and minesweeping off South Foreland, just north of the white cliffs of Dover. The ship struck a mine laid down by the German submarine UC-71 and sank with the loss of all hands. Moses's body was never recovered. He is remembered on the Chatham Naval Memorial, Chatham, Kent, England.

We appreciate all you do to keep us at our strongest.


