





performed marriage and other church ceremonies. He also participated in the cod fishery with crews based at English Harbour. The most prominent of the Trinity surgeons, however, was Dr. John Clinch, who married and lived in Trinity from 1783 until he died there in 1819. A close colleague and friend of Dr. Edward Jenner, the inventor of small pox vaccine, Clinch is credited with making a major advance in medical history by introducing this new discovery to North America at Trinity in 1799 by first inoculating his own family, then some 700 persons in Trinity Bight, and, shortly thereafter, at the request of the Governor, hundreds more around St. John's. Also an ordained Anglican priest and SPG missionary, Clinch was appointed a stipendiary magistrate in 1791 after years being a Justice of the Peace and Collector of Customs. He too indulged in the cod fishery by acquiring fishing rooms at Bay de Verde.

Quaker Whites of Poole, Jeffrey & Street, and Robert Slade

Joseph (1685-1771) and Samuel (1674-1747) sons of Samuel White (1625-1720), Quaker of Poole and Mary Taverner of Bay de Verde, Newfoundland, became principal merchants in Trinity in the early 18th century and owned extensive premises on the West Side. Joseph owned at least 37 ships in his life and initiated the ship-building industry at Trinity in 1723 when he launched the *Joseph*, a 100-ton brig. He died in 1771 with an immense fortune earned from the Newfoundland trade at Trinity, Old Perlican, Bonavista, Heart's Content, Greenspond and Fogo. The Whites were among the first to build warehouse and stores to supply working crews and Newfoundland settlers yearround. They were pioneers in establishing furring, salmon and seal fisheries, winter woodcutting and boatbuilding. From 1751 Joseph entrusted his Newfoundland affairs to agents and seacaptains. By his will he directed his Newfoundland trade be carried on by his nephew John Jeffrey and five captain/agents: Peter Street, Thomas Street, James Randell, Joseph Randell and William Munday in partnership for 14 years. Within a few years Jeffrey and Thomas Street bought out the others and until 1789, when they dissolved (and divided their assets including fishing rooms and 7 ships), were a leading Poole-Trinity firm in the Newfoundland trade. They then traded separately. Jeffrey rented in 1805 and sold in 1809 his Trinity properties to Robert Slade of Poole. Street died in 1805 and his three sons - his heirs - all died by 1809, and his properties in Newfoundland fell to others including Robert Slade.

Benjamin Lester (1724-1802)

Son of Rachael Taverner of Bay de Verde by her marriage to Francis Lester of Poole, Benjamin became the principal and most influential citizen of Trinity in the 1760s and 70s. He married his cousin Susannah Taverner, daughter of Jacob, of Trinity and acquired the Taverner Plantation. In Trinity he served as Justice of the Peace and Naval Officer. His children, a boy and four daughters, were born in Trinity but sent to Poole for education at an early age. Until 1776 when he returned to Poole, Lester spent his summers in Trinity and occasionally overwintered. From the 1780s until his death, Lester was the leading magnate of the Newfoundland trade, the principal citizen and largest rate payer in Poole, largest ship owner in the Newfoundland cod trade, who exported annually 15-20 percent of the total British production of codfish and seal skins, and supplied 5000 - 7000 residents on the northeast coast. He served as mayor of Poole (1781-3), Member of Parliament (1790-6), and was the leading spokesperson among English-Newfoundland merchants. He kept a daily diary between 1761 and 1801 most of it extant.

18th century Trinity Merchants, Inhabitants and Migratory Residents

Through the 18th century in a piece-meal fashion, Trinity gradually acquired the institutional structures and functions of a typical English town although it remained pre-dominantly a place of summer fishing and related activities, overwhelmingly dominated by single male servants yearround. In 1728, the first Justices of the Peace - planters Jacob Taverner and Francis Squibb - were appointed to hold petty and quarter sessions to settle civil disputes. Surrogate courts were held annually towards the end of the fishing season (at least from 1766) by naval officers appointed by the Commodores (Naval Governors). In 1778 a local court house and a jail were built "with a tax of one shilling on all servants" and in 1791 the surgeon-clergyman, John Clinch, was appointed as the first Stipendiary Magistrate for the district. Most cases recorded court minutes involved disputes between masters and fishing servants over wages, debts, working and living conditions, violence (one of the other) and negligence of obligations. Servants appear as plaintiffs or defendants in 65 percent of the 160 cases in the period (1753-74). Debt claims accounted for nearly half, neglect of duty about 20 percent, personal assaults 10 percent, and the balance involved property disputes, drunkenness and other misbehaviour (Sabbath breaking). Court records and missionary letters allude to many incidents of civil disturbance, robberies, rioting and violence in the 1760s and early 70s, mostly by unemployed Irish servants, to the extent that in 1767 and for several years following, no one would accept appointment as Justice of the Peace. Meanwhile, while the merchants, their agents and main employees (clerks, captains and tradesmen), and leading planters (middlemen in the cod-fishery) lived in relative comfort most of the time, the poorer planters and most servants were often subjected to distressing and wretched conditions by fluctuating circumstances especially fishing failures. According to Society for the Propagation of the Gospel (SPG) missionary Balfour a poor fishery in 1767 ruined the richest planters and wrote: "the miseries of the Poor are Inexpressible."

From at least 1747, when Dr. Samuel Harris came, and most likely before, Trinity was served by local surgeons enticed to Newfoundland by merchants to care for their servants. The surgeons, locally known as "Doctors" performed a multiplicity of public duties. Harris served as a Justice of the Peace for several decades and kept meticulous minutes of court sessions. On occasion he

John Fowlow



John Fowlow, the son of Abraham Fowlow and Mary Francis Malone, was born at Trinity East on February 3rd, 1887. John joined the Royal Navy Reserve in 1908 and was called to active duty in November, 1914. He survived the war but was killed when his ship HMS Erin's Isle stuck a mine on February 7th, 1919 while minesweeping near the Thames River Estuary. He was 32.

Family Tree

During the war John served on several small naval vessels involved in supplying goods and sweeping mines around the British Isles. His final posting was to HMS Erin's Isle, a paddle steamer converted to a minesweeper, which he joined on January 1st, 1919.

John was married to Lillian Bartlett from Goose Cove when WW I broke out. While John was on leave back in Newfoundland in the spring of 1917 Lillian became pregnant and they had a daughter, Daphne Bartlett Fowlow, in February 1918. Tragically, Daphne died in March 1918 at the age of 5 weeks. Lillian lost her husband John less than a year later. She never remarried.

John's remains were never recovered. He is remembered on the Beaumont-Hamel Memorial, Beaumont-Hamel, France.
