

Tis the season.... for frozen pipes!!

Here are some helpful tips to help prevent it from happening to you.

Insulate pipes that may be prone to freezing, especially near exterior walls and in crawl spaces. This can be done with foam pipe covers. An electric heater installed in your crawl space can give you some extra peace of mind.

Seal air leaks in your home to stop cold air from getting in. Check around windows and doors, electrical wiring, dryer vents and skirting. Caulk any cracks that might let in cold air especially places where pipes go from inside to outside.

Outdoor faucets are the first to freeze. Hoses should already be removed and taps should be drained.

Always know where your main water shut off valve is located!!!



TRIVIA

*The first priest to visit Trinity, Fr. James Sinnott, arrived in 1815.

Church of the Most Holy Trinity Trinity, NL



Holy Trinity Roman Catholic Church is an historic and architectural gem in the heart of historic Trinity. It has stood as you see it today since 1833 - the oldest wooden church in Newfoundland and one of the very oldest churches in all of Canada to remain in continuous use.

The church served generations of Irish Catholics. Prominent names included Eagan, Hanlon, Lahey, Power, Shaheen, Toulin, and McGrath. Over time the passing of these and out-migration so reduced the congregation that Holy Trinity was amalgamated with neighbouring parishes in Bonavista and Port Union. After the departure of the last priest, Fr Leo Burke in 1958, services continued to be held but much of the care and maintenance of the building came to be undertaken by the McGrath family, the last remaining Catholics in the community. That the building remains in such good condition is a tribute to the quality of workmanship and materials used and the stewardship of worshipers over its nearly two-hundred-year history.

In recognition of its historical and aesthetic values, the Heritage Foundation of Newfoundland and Labrador designated Holy Trinity Church a Heritage Structure in 2004. The building is a fine example of the Gothic Revival style popular for many churches of the era. The inclusion of a balcony is unusual but the pointed windows and central tower flanked by two buttresses is typical. The building remains virtually as it always has been. It continues to rely on oil lamps rather than electric power which has never been installed and has kept in place the sheet metal covers on the second-row pews to protect these from the heat of the stove. Of additional interest to many visitors is that the church has left in place the high altar and communion rail, vestiges of the pre-Vatican *II* Council (1962-1965) liturgy that had been in place for several centuries.

That Holy Trinity remains in use today for summer visitors and occasional weddings is largely thanks to the time given by visiting priests and the generosity of summer residents and visitors who value the place it continues to hold in the heart of this historic community. Its intimate charm invites the hurried traveler a moment's reflection and a quiet interlude.



Criteria for student positions varies depending on the available grants.

All applicants must:

- be between the ages of 15-30;

- be legally entitled to work in the province and Canada;

- be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident or have refugee status in Canada; - not hold another job of 30 or more hours per week during the employment period.

Some grant programs will also require applicants to:

- be enrolled in high school (Level I, II or III) or a post-secondary institution in the 2023-2024 school calendar year; and

- be intending to return to school full-time in September 2024; or

- be graduating from Level III in June 2024 and planning to pursue an education at a post-secondary institution in September 2024.

A Brief History of Trinity Historical Society Inc. by Jim Miller, General Manager

On Feb 7, 1964 a group of like minded individuals got together to form the Trinity Historic Sites Committee whose purpose was to develop Fort (Admiral's) Point, and Ryder's and Gun Hills as National Historic Sites. The committee also began collecting information from local, provincial, national and international sources to document Trinity's historic resources, heritage and history. Upon its success in holding an exhibit in 1966 at the Court House of what they had gathered over two years the group purchased the DeGrish home on Church Road and opened the Trinity Museum in 1967.

The Society since this time has been in the forefront of the preservation, presentation and promotion of the historic resources, heritage and history of Trinity and the surrounding communities and of the economic development of the area. Many of the founding members of the Trinity Historical Society also helped with the formation of the Community Council in 1969 and the development of the Heritage Area. The Historical Society has achieved a number of accomplishments over the years, on its own and with partners. It remains a leading organization in the heritage community in the province with a dedicated group of volunteers and staff.

The Society has an active and engaged executive with a core group of volunteers that can be faithfully called upon when time warrants. The Society has a membership of 169 people and we welcome application from anyone. Please see in this edition of the Enterprise details regarding becoming a member and the application form.

Trinity Historical Society Inc. (THS) was founded in 1964, incorporated in 1971, and received registered charity status in 1977. It currently operates the Trinity Historical Society Archives (1966), Trinity Museum (1967), Green Family Forge (1991), the Court House, Gaol and General Building (1996), the Lester-Garland House (1997), Cooperage (2008) and Fort Point Lighthouse (2012).

Orlando embarked from St. John's on board S.S. Sicilian on July 7th, 1916 and joined C Company of the Regiment on October 22nd, 1916 near Guedecourt, France. Over the next four months he took part in intense trench warfare against the enemy. He was killed near Sally-Saillisel by enemy bombardment on February 25th, 1917. He has no known grave and is remembered on the Beaumont-Hamel Memorial, Beaumont-Hamel, France



Orlando Brown was born at Trinity East on August 23rd, 1898 to William George Brown and Sarah Fowlow. He was a fisherman before enlisting in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment on April 29th, 1916. He was killed in action February 25th, 1917. He was 18.
