



In this edition of our Newsletter, we present the story of the ninth of the men who are remembered on the War Monument in Port Rexton.



James Edmund Butler



James, the son of Edmund James Butler and Emily Bailey, was born at Port Rexton on May 20th, 1911. He died on July 17th, 1940. He was 29.



Family Tree

James joined the Newfoundland Overseas Forestry Unit (NOFU) at the beginning of World War II and traveled to Scotland on-board SS Chrobry in December 1939. He had married Susanna Locke in 1935 and they had one son Edmund George Butler who was born in 1938. James served as a lumberjack in the Overseas Forestry Unit. The work of the NOFU was vital to the war effort. He died at the Royal Infirmary in Aberdeen and is buried in Tullich Old Churchyard, Ballater, Aberdeenshire, Scotland.
