Get to know Your Drains

The best way to keep drains clean is to limit what you put in them. Keep food, coffee grounds and grease out of kitchen sinks.

Fishing Ship Rooms & Private Property

The conversion of shore spaces from migratory fishing ships' rooms to permanently tenured, privately owned premises is a process documented at Trinity as early as 18th century from the extant "Draught ... of William Taverner's Roome" by Naval Cap-tain Thomas Cleasby of HMS Gally, "in the p[r]sence of my Self, the Admiral, Vice-Admiral and Rear Admiral with several other Masters of Ships and Inhabitants ... this 2nd Day of July 1700." The property including a waterfront measurement of 236 feet, a stage, flake, a salt store, a lodging house (for fishing servants), a store house and a "Planter's dwelling house" is almost certainly on or near the site described by Southwood as the usual "Vice-Admiral's" room.

Although initially awarded to William Taverner, a Poole captain & ship-owner, it soon came into the possession of his kinsman Jacob Taverner, was transferred to Benjamin Lester, Jacob's son-in-law, in 1748, and acquired by George Garland (Lester's son-in-law) in 1802. The Garland Plantation was sold to the Ryan Family in 1906. Today "Taverner's Roome" contains the restored Lester-Garland House, the Ryan Store (built initially by Lester), the Parish Hall, and the Court House and the Rising Tide Theatre.

For 200 years, 1748-1948, this property was the headquarters of a succession of mercantile firms mainly engaged in the production and marketing of salt cod. Similarly, by the 1730s Southwood's Admiral's Room on the Southside (inside Fort Point) had become a fixed mercantile establishment, owned by a succession of English firms including Masters & Ballard of Poole 1720s-late 1740s; Devonshire, Reeves & Webb of Bristol (1748-1763); and Thomas Street of Poole 1770s-1805.

Poole Mercantile Colony and Centre of Trade for the Northeast Coast

In the late 1600s most of the migratory fishermen in Trinity Bight came from the Channel Islands (Jersey) and Weymouth in Dorset. Fishing ships from Poole mean-while sent their summer fishing crews to places such as Bonavista, Bay de Verde and Old Perlican. About 1700, however, beginning with the Taverners and their relatives, the Whites, Poole traders and ship-owners began to concentrate their shipping activities and supplies increasingly in Trinity mainly because the harbour, with its narrow entrance, was thought defensible. Additionally, there was plenty of space for shore premises, abundant sheltered anchorage, and reasonably good fishing grounds in the adjacent bight (and just across the bay at Old Perlican and Silly Cove). By the 1720s Trinity Harbour was visited annually by 250-300 migratory fishermen and had about 30 settler families almost entirely of English provenance from Poole-Christchurch - Ringwood-Wareham area (Dorset and New Forest region of Hampshire) and was visited annually by 250-300 summer fishermen including considerable numbers of Irish. By this time the fishing rooms occupied by planters (or residents) and migratory fishing crews were likely mixed and mingled and distinctions were becoming blurred be- cause under the Act of WM III (1699) fishing rooms could be held from year to year as long as they were occupied. This demographic situation, particularly the growth of a significant overwintering population, warranted the appointment of magistrates, constables, surgeons and a resident missionary. Poole merchants built stores and ware-houses to supply and trade with the growing resident population on a year-round basis and to promote winter-early spring economic activities such as furring, woodcutting, sawing lumber, boat and ship building but especially seal hunting. The Poole Quakers, Joseph and Samuel White (sons of Mary Tayerner of Bay de Verde), were pioneers in these ventures. Joseph was also associated with the early 1720s development of commercial salmon fishing in Bonavista Bay and initiated shipbuilding at Trinity as early as 1723. Other Poole merchants and traders, particularly Isaac and Benjamin Lester (sons of Rachael Taverner of Bay de Verde), followed suite and by the 1740s Trinity was emerging as the principal trading centre on the northeast coast of Newfoundland. It had become de facto a Poole mercantile colony, not planned but prospering and very successful in commercial enterprise, and concomitantly, enabling and promoting the growth of a resident



Dear Friends,

In 2021 you helped us raise \$4,825.00 to assist with the repairs to the Cemetery fence which was completed in Spring 2022, we thank you most graciously for your assistance in this work to keep our cemetery in good condition.

Aaron King



Aaron, the son of Noah and Jessie Anne King, and brother of William John King, was born at New Bonaventure on August 18th, 1896. He enlisted in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment on April 19th, 1916. His brother William John had enlisted on April 4th. Aaron joined the regiment on October 22nd, 1916. Shortly afterward he became ill with dysentery and was evacuated to England. He rejoined the regiment on August 28th, 1917 and died on December 3rd. He was 21.



Family Tree

Private Aaron King was at first reported as...missing in action...on December 3rd, 1917, during the final days of the withdrawal from the French villages of Masnières and Marcoing. However, a subsequent German report dated March 14th, 1918, and forwarded to London through the offices of the Geneva Red Cross, documented the identification of his remains and their burial by the enemy in Seranvilles Cemetery in December of 1917. This cemetery has never been found. He is remembered on the Beaumont Hamel Memorial, Beaumont Hamel, France. Aaron's brother, William John, was killed on April 14th, 1917.
