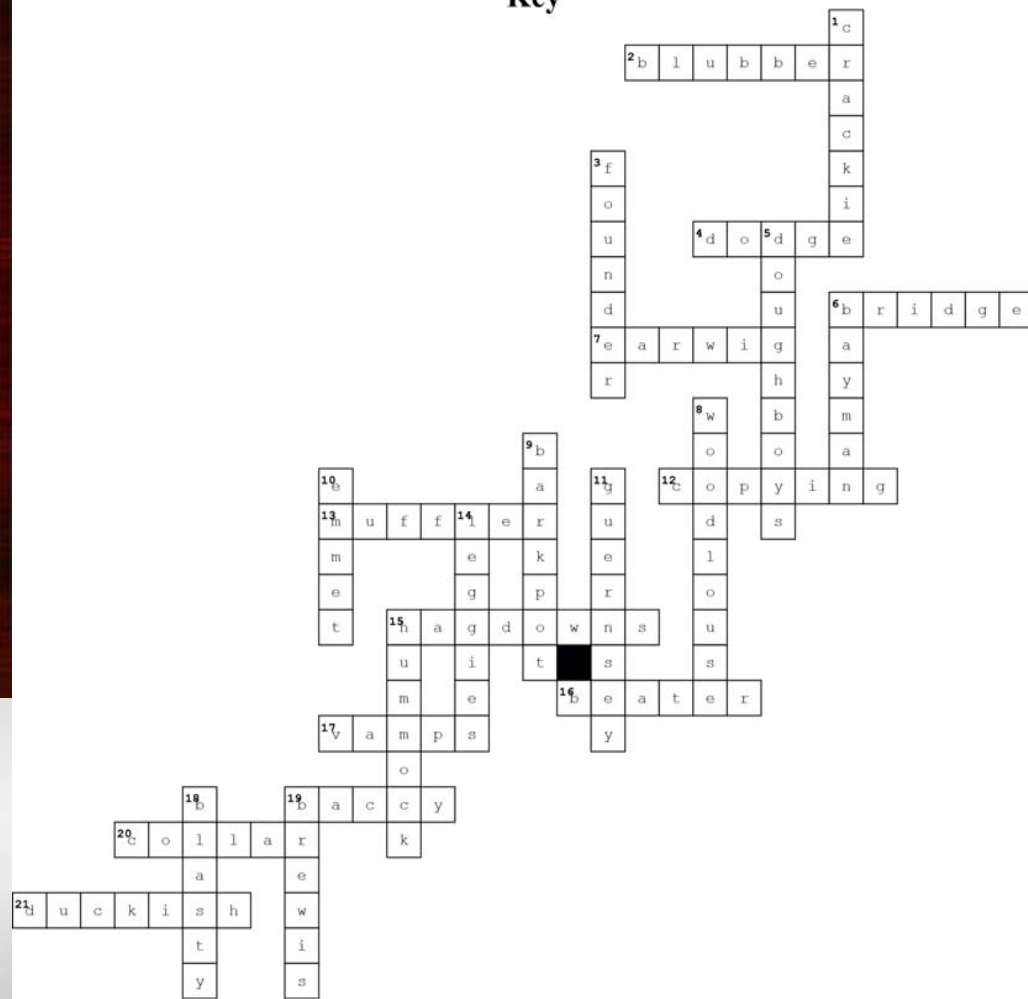

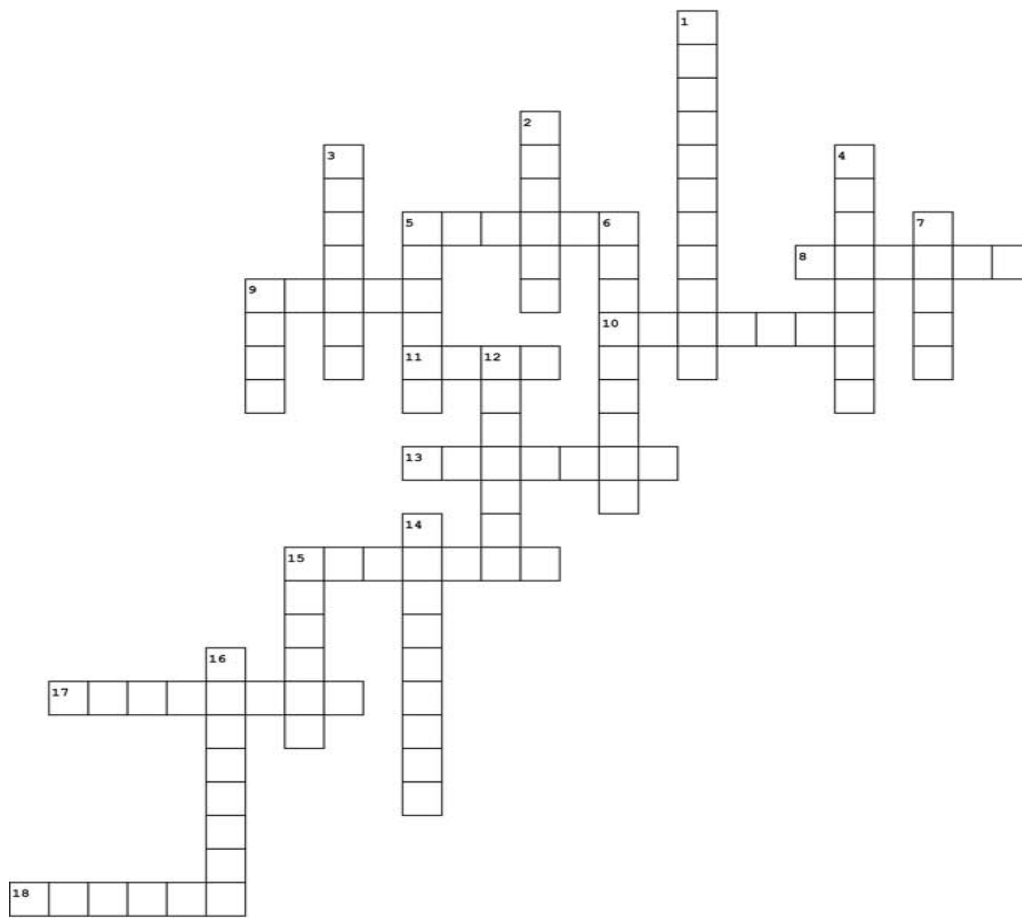

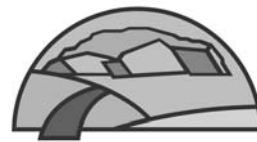

Major Chris Kane enrolled in the Canadian Forces in 1987 as a Vehicle Technician. After completion of basic training, he attended the Canadian Forces School of Electrical Mechanical and Engineering at CFB Borden. Throughout his years of service, he has completed a number of operational deployments, including UN Mission to Namibia in 1989; UN Protection Force Croatia in 1994; Domestic Response to Winnipeg Floods in 1997; CAF deployment to Eritrea as part of the National Support Element in 2000; CAF deployment to Haiti in 2004 and 2 deployments to Afghanistan in 2006 and 2010.

Adopt a Headstone Project Update

May 30, 2022

The Trinity Historical Society (THS) is pleased to report that Robyn Lacy and Ian Petty from Black Cat Cemetery Preservation completed two weeks of work on the restoration of the headstones in the churchyard at St. Paul's on May 20th. During this time, they reset, repaired and cleaned 75 headstones which is about 1 headstone per hour of work. They will return for a third week on June 20th and we anticipate that another 37-38 headstones will be restored during this time.

The cost for Black Cat to perform this work was \$14,669.78 in addition to the cost of two loads of crusher dust (\$70.00) which we supplied on site. Robyn and Ian are experts in cemetery preservation and we are very pleased with their work.

Our fundraising continues. Thus far we have raised enough funds to cover the cost of the two weeks of work in May and the week scheduled for June. The ticket draw for the original painting, The Dunfield Rocks, donated by Ed Roche, is on May 31st.

The success of this project depended on the efforts and contributions of numerous individuals. Once again, we would like to thank Corey Jones for providing accommodation for Ian and Robyn at Trinity Cabins and we thank Pam Sullivan and Ed Roche for donating the beautiful hooked rug and painting for sale on tickets. We thank those members of THS who helped with ticket sales and we thank Pam Sullivan and Sharon Jeans for their communications expertise. We thank THS staff members Jim Miller and Dean Bailey for their work in the organization and implementation of the Project. We would like to thank all of those who donated to the Project, those who bought tickets on the hooked rug and the painting, and the Government of NL for their support through the Come Home Year Program. The Adopt a Headstone Project would not have been possible without this considerable effort and financial support.

The churchyard looks lovely following this restoration. We believe caring for these headstones honours the memory of those who are buried there.

Further work to complete the restoration on the remaining headstones will depend on our ability to raise additional funds for the Project.

Lester-Garland Craft and Gift Shop

Lester-Garland House, 41 West Street, Trinity

The Lester-Garland Craft and Gift Shop was opened in 2014 as part of the Bonavista Peninsula Crafts Initiative which included the not-for-profit organizations Cape Random Trust/Random Passage, Sir William Coaker Heritage Foundation, Trinity Crafts (Bonaventure to English Harbour Development Association) and the Home From The Sea Foundation, in addition to the Trinity Historical Society (THS). This initiative was intended to develop shop standards and guidelines, and improve the quality of products offered for sale.

At that time, the Trinity Historical Society was the only one of these organizations that did not have a craft and gift shop. THS operated two living history museums, The Green Family Forge and the Cooperage and it was thought that it would be beneficial to have a shop in which to display and sell items from these museums, as well as other crafts and gifts. Such a shop would promote local crafts and provide additional revenue to help fund the Society's mandate to present, preserve, and promote our history.

The kitchen space in the Lester-Garland House was chosen as an ideal setting for the store as it would also provide another attraction for visitors to the House. The shop staff at the Craft Council of Newfoundland and Labrador, the Craft Specialist at the Provincial Government, and the Cultural Craft Project Planner all provided advice on the set up of the shop. The Cultural Craft Project was a unique project which connected not-for-profit tourism site operators and craft producers and artisans to promote customized story telling products.

THS has endeavoured to focus on items of historic interest and those made at the Forge and Cooperage. In general, the Lester Garland Giftshop has attempted to avoid selling products available in other local giftshops as a measure of respect and courtesy to our business neighbours. If a craft producer was selling products at another store in Trinity, then Trinity Historical Society would not sell the same products. However, if the craft producer could offer an additional product line, then it might be sold at the Lester Garland Gift Shop.

In our 2022 season handcrafted products from twenty-four craft producers are carried in the store, including those made by our Cooper, Darren Hookey, and our Blacksmiths, Wade Ivany and Devin Hookey. These crafts interpret and preserve our culture while at the same time

Vincent Miller



Vincent Miller, the son of Martin Miller and Emma Morris of Spaniard's Cove, was born in New York City on May 16, 1924. The family relocated to Trouty, NL in the late 1920s. As a US citizen Vincent enlisted in the United States Air Force in WW II.

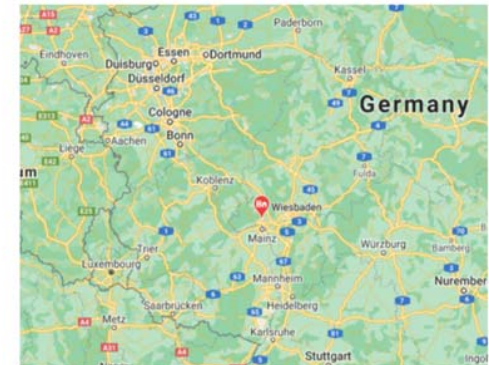


Family Tree

Vincent remained in Europe as part of the occupying forces after the war. He died in Weisbaden, Germany on January 10th, 1947 and his remains were returned home and interred in Trouty Cemetery on April 6th, 1947. He was 22.
