



THE LIFE AND WORK OF WILLIAM BULLOCK

Many are familiar with the historical significance of the work of John Clinch. A related lesser known, but historically significant part of Trinity's past, is the story of William Bullock.

Born in Essex, England in 1797 William Bullock was educated at the Bluecoat School in London in preparation for a career as a British naval officer. His first posting in 1815 was as a midshipman on the *Mutine*, which took part in the bombardment of Algiers under Lord Exmouth in 1816. Later, young Bullock served on the *Snap* as mate and assistant surveyor.

Legend has it that during Bullock's time as a young naval officer a sailor was washed overboard on an Atlantic crossing and Bullock dove into the ocean to save the sailor from drowning until a launch could be rowed from the ship to rescue the two men.

The *Snap* did extensive hydrographic surveys around the coast of Newfoundland spending considerable time in the port of Trinity. It was during his time in Trinity that Bullock would have met the Reverend John Clinch and his family, in particular Clinch's only daughter, Mary. Bullock is said to have been disturbed by the apparent neglect of the spiritual needs of the people. He was discharged in 1821 for reasons of health and offered to serve in Newfoundland as a missionary for the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel. He was ordained deacon in England 31 March 1822 and raised to the priesthood two weeks later. Subsequent to the passing of Reverend Clinch in 1819, Reverend Bullock returned to Trinity and became rector of St. Paul's. A year after his return William Bullock married Mary Clinch. William and Mary had a long a fruitful marriage with ten children.

One Sunday morning during Reverend Bullock's sermon at St. Paul's, a sailor from a ship in port suddenly rose from a pew to shout, I know that man – He saved my life many years ago." Indeed, it was the sailor who Bullock had saved as a midshipman.

Bullock was respected by the people of Trinity serving them as pastor, doctor, and magistrate until 1840. After a brief period in St. John's, he left to serve in Digby N.S and seven years later moved to Halifax. After many years of service in Nova Scotia Bullock reached the pinnacle of his career when, in 1864, he was appointed the first dean of St. Luke's, the cathedral church of the diocese of Nova Scotia.

William Bullock is remembered as well for the publication of a collection of 166 hymns, some of which are still sung in Church of England churches in Canada. In Newfoundland, perhaps his most popular hymn is "We Love the Place, O God".

William Bullock died 7 March 1874 at Halifax N. S. and was buried in Camp Hill Cemetery.





The Trinity Historical Society (THS) is pleased to report that donations in the amount of \$9,238.00.00 have been received thus far toward the "Adopt a Headstone Project". A description of the project and how to donate can be found on the THS Website and our Facebook Page. We also applied for funding from the Come Home Year 2022 Cultural Funding Program of the Government of Newfoundland and Labrador, and we have been informed that we have been awarded a grant in the amount of \$13,000.00 in support of this project. In addition, we continue to sell tickets on an original painting, The Dunfield Rocks, donated by Ed Roche. Tickets are \$2.00 each; three for \$5.00, and are available at multiple locations as outlined on our Facebook posts and website. The ticket draw will be on May 31st. We anticipate completing restoration of the 50 most damaged headstones in May of this year and we will be able to start work on the remaining stones.

As always, the THS welcomes application for membership from anyone interested in the objectives and activities of the Society.

In this edition of our Newsletter, we present the story of the 15th of the men whose names are inscribed on the War Monument in St. Paul's Churchyard.



Family Tree

Frank, a teacher before enlisting, joined the battalion in France on December 12, 1916. He contracted dysentery in February, 1917 and was invalided to England. He returned to the regiment in April and on October 9 was killed in action during an advance on German positions along the Broenbeek River near Langemarck, Belgium. He was interred on the battlefield. His body was later exhumed and reburied in Cement House Cemetery, West-Vlaanderen, Belgium. His memorial window in the Mortuary Chapel in Trinity states his age was 23 at the time of his death but his birth date in his military records is 1896 and his age at death was 21.



Frank Morris



Frank Morris, the son of Charles Morris and Annie Susannah Brown, was born at Trinity on April 27, 1896. He enlisted in the Royal Newfoundland Regiment on July 21, 1916. He lost his life on October 9, 1917. He was 21.
