




His legacy of service and kindness will live on in all of those who knew him.

Although it is impossible to thank everyone individually, please be assured that every act of sympathy and kindness will always be remembered and treasured in our hearts.

With Sincere Thanks Lilly, Stephen, Trudy, Brad and family Taverner planter/settler units – Margaret Taverner with 10 servants; and her sons William married with a child and 10 servants; Andrew single with 18 servants and Robert single with 10 servants. As far as can be determined Margaret and her husband William are the ancestors of all Taverners in Newfoundland. William Taverner, Margaret's husband, was ill at the time of the 1675 census and then residing in Poole. Meanwhile Margaret oversaw their fishing operation in Bay de Verde and was accorded the status of "planter". William's will written in 1679 records him as "of the Town and County of Poole, fisherman". The will mentions wife "Margarett", sons Andrew, Robert, John, James, William, daughters Mary White, Elizabeth Williams, and sons-in-law Samuel White and William Williams, grandchildren William White and Samuel White. To sons John and James, William bequeathed "a plantation in Bay de Verde". The other older sons evidently were already provided for and settled in the fishery.

Following French raids and the destruction of their Bay de Verde fishing rooms in 1697, two Taverners relocated to Trinity Harbour. A census of 1702 records William Taverner at Trinity with six (6) winter servants and 14 summer servants, and Jacob Taverner with two (2) winter and six (6) summer servants. Genealogical data indicate that William Taverner (the one who made his will in 1679 above) died in Poole 27 March 1680; Margaret Taverner his wife (census 1675) the matriarchal planter of Bay de Verde died at Poole 14 June 1701, and Jacob Taverner (1671-1751) died at Trinity. Jacob was the son of James Taverner, and thus a grandson of William & Margaret. He would have been just four (4) years of age in 1675 and about 30 years when he moved to Trinity.

Jacob was father of Susannah, wife of Benjamin Lester. He was also Justice of the Peace 1728-31 but was removed from this position for being a "Dissenter." He is credited for building at his own expense the first Church at Trinity.

In 1748, when Benjamin Lester married Susannah, the couple received a wooden house on the property known as Taverner's Plantation. Eventually Lester acquired the whole plantation.

To a large degree Benjamin Lester was educated and gained useful experience in the Newfoundland trade through his Taverner kinship connections. These connections were essential influences in the background of a man who began as a boy apprentice in the Newfoundland fishery and became, by the 1780s, the largest, most influential, and wealthiest merchant in the English-Newfoundland trade.

The Lester family of Poole and Trinity descended from John Lester, a London carpenter who settled at Poole in the late 1600s. His son Francis Lester became a cooper at Poole and got involved in the Newfoundland trade as an importer and dealer in cod and seal oil. Francis married Rachael Taverner, daughter of William and Rebecca Taverner, a pioneer family of Bay de Verde, Newfoundland. When Francis died in 1737, son Isaac took over the family coopering trade and interest in the transatlantic cod trade. Younger son Benjamin meanwhile, then a mere youth of thirteen years, was next year taken to Newfoundland and tutored in seafaring and the cod fishery by Taverner relatives. [variant spellings of Taverner incl. Tavenor, & Tavernor]

On his maternal side, Benjamin Lester had multiple kinship links with the Taverner family of Poole and Newfoundland. As noted, his mother was Rachael Taverner of Bay de Verde. Her family were prominent adventurers, seafarers, fisher folk, explorers, pioneers, and Newfoundland planters (settlers) of the 17th century. Taverner females were matriarchs in major Poole-Newfoundland merchant dynasties of the late 17th and 18th centuries, among them: Whites (Samuel & Joseph) from Samuel White & Mary Taverner, Masters from John Masters & Sarah Taverner, and as noted, Lesters from Francis & Rachel.

Poole-Bay de Verde Taverners also intermarried with early lesser-well-to do but significant Newfoundland settler families among them: Bailey/Bayly, Bellows, Barnes, Coates, Coombes, Cook, Corbin, Evely, Frampton, Hiscock, Rowe, Sweet, Vardy, and Walters, as well as with non-resident individuals (Whitewood, Williams, and Woodford) visiting as ship's captains or in other capacities in the Newfoundland trade.

The Taverner family was the largest extended English family in late 17th century Newfoundland as recorded in several censuses taken in 1670s. At that time the family was confined to the Bay de Verde area. The 1675 census included four

In this edition of our Newsletter, we present the story of the 20th of the men whose names are inscribed on the War Monument in St. Paul's Churchyard.

On February 21, 1918 Walter was serving as a seaman on board the SS Rio Verde, a 4025 ton defensively armed British steamer, enroute from Glasgow to Milford Haven, Wales with a cargo of coal. The Rio Verde was torpedoed without warning 4 miles west of Crammag Head, Mull Of Galloway by U 100. She sank with the loss of all 20 of her crew. The bodies of 5 of the casualties including Walter were buried at Kirkmaiden Parish Cemetery, Wigtownshire, Scotland.

Walter Marsh, the son of Arthur H. Marsh and Sarah Jane Spurrell of Cuckhold's Cove, was born on November 12th, 1892. He joined the Newfoundland Division of the Royal Naval Reserves in WWI. He died in the sinking of the SS Rio Verde on February 21st, 1918. He was 25.
