A residential service panel will contain either fuses or circuit breakers and is usually located in a utility room, laundry room or basement. The panel will likely be grey in colour. It is important, in the case of an emergency, to know where your panel is located and how to turn off the power.

When you open the panel door you will see rows of individual circuit breakers that control various locations throughout your home. To turn off power to the entire house, flip off the main breaker located at the top of the panel.

If your panel contains fuses, look for a main breaker or disconnect. It could be located at the top or bottom.

Emergencies can happen at inconvenient times or at night when its dark and time is of the essence. Make sure the pathway to your panel is clear and unobstructed.

Loyal Trinity Volunteer Ranger Award 2024 - awarded to Francis (Frank) Lapointe

The Loyal Trinity Volunteer Ranger Award (LTVR) is given in recognition of a person, past or present, who has demonstrated a commitment to the preservation, presentation and promotion of Trinity Bight's collective heritage.

The Trinity Historical Society was pleased to present the 2024 award to Trinity Bight's own, Francis (Frank) Lapointe on Friday, August 16 as part of our auction at the Trinity Museum.

Throughout his distinguished career as a multimedia artist and architectural designer Frank's work has reflected the heritage of not only the Trinity Bight area but also the Province.

The Newfoundland Postcard Series, which is currently on display at Lester-Garland House in Trinity until October 11, are visual impressions which represent the way of life and most seminal events and activities in this region's history. They include the seal fishery, the railway, marine disasters and the making of fish, to name a few.

The Rooms permanent art collection has many of Frank's art works, among them water colours, evocative of the Trinity Bight landscape.

Frank's architectural design demonstrates his sensitivity to the heritage and environment of place. Frank's building designs and restorations can be found throughout Trinity Bight and beyond.

His highly acclaimed designs are respectful of the vernacular and heritage elements of place. They are often presented with a modern twist which marries the contemporary with the historic yet adds an element of freshness, whether it be through the use of colour or a discreet angle, expertly placed, so as not to disturb the scale.

Frank's architectural design and vision has made an extensive and lasting contribution to the heritage of Trinity Bight. His art work has been collected and exhibited locally, nationally and internationally, thereby preserving, presenting and promoting the collective heritage of our place.

During Frank's acceptance of the award he conveyed that the role of the Loyal Trinity Volunteer Rangers was the responsibility for protecting Trinity and that he in his role in designing homes for Trinity he wanted to preserve Trinity's architectural heritage.

Frank, you have done an amazing job of doing so.

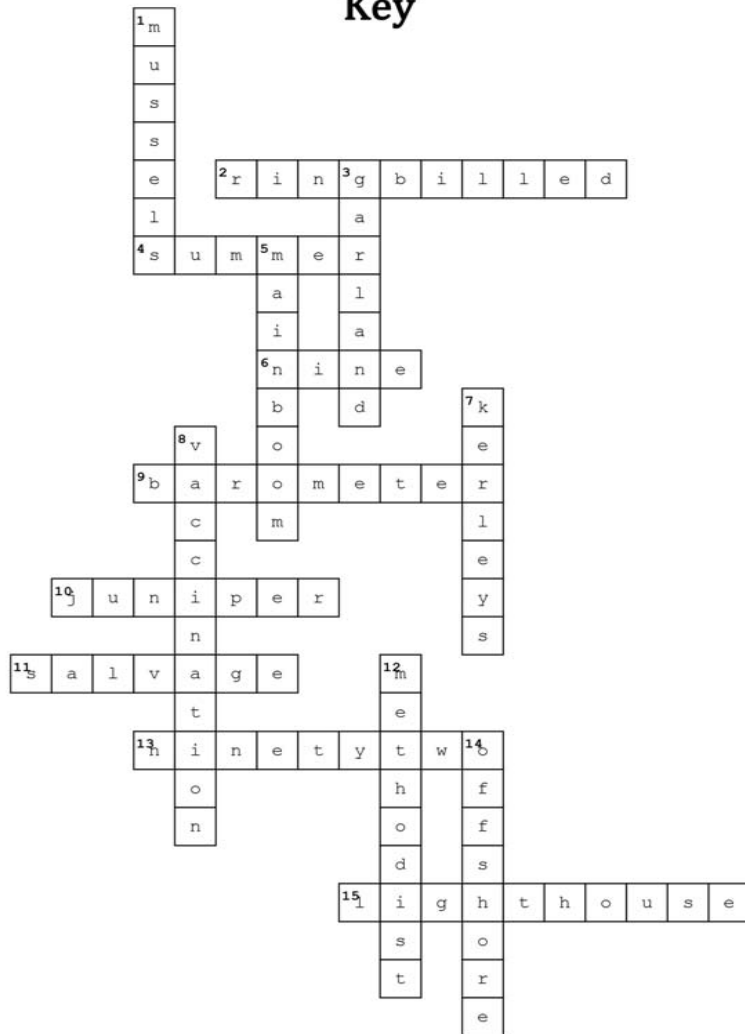

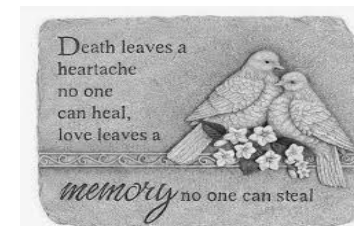
First of all we would like to thank everyone who visited, called and supported the family during our Mom's illness.

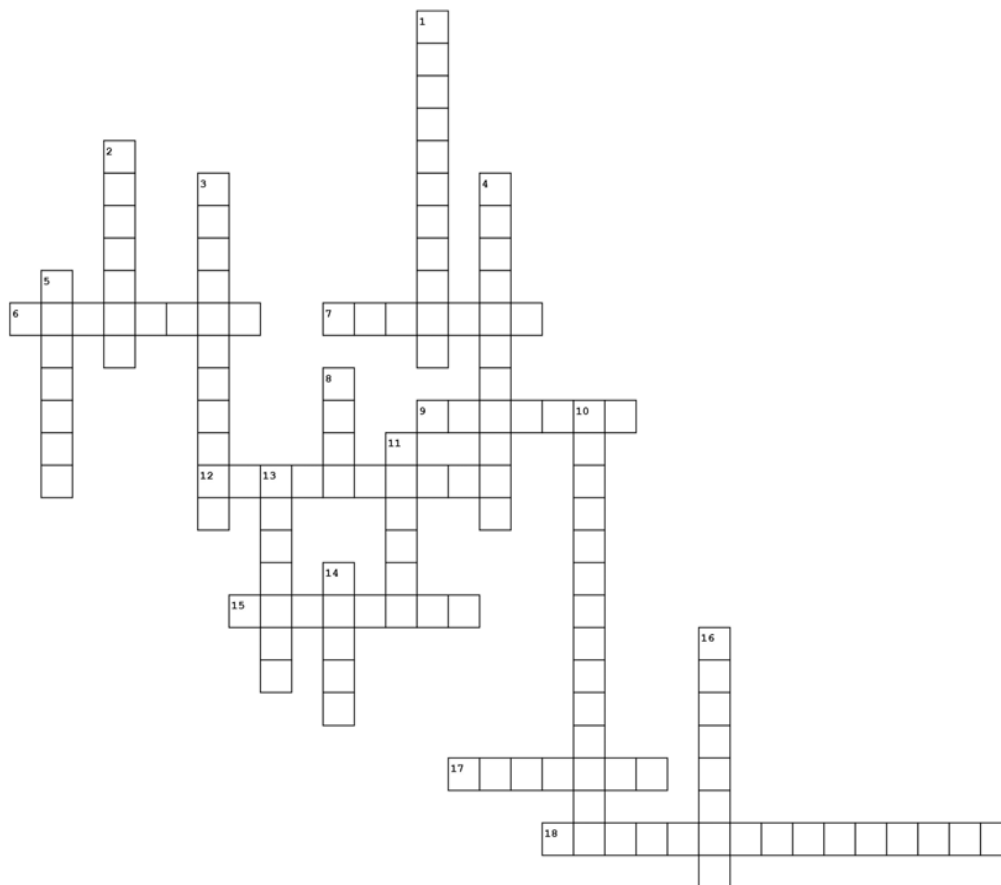

In this edition of our Newsletter, we present the story of the fifth of the men who are remembered on the War Monument in Port Rexton.

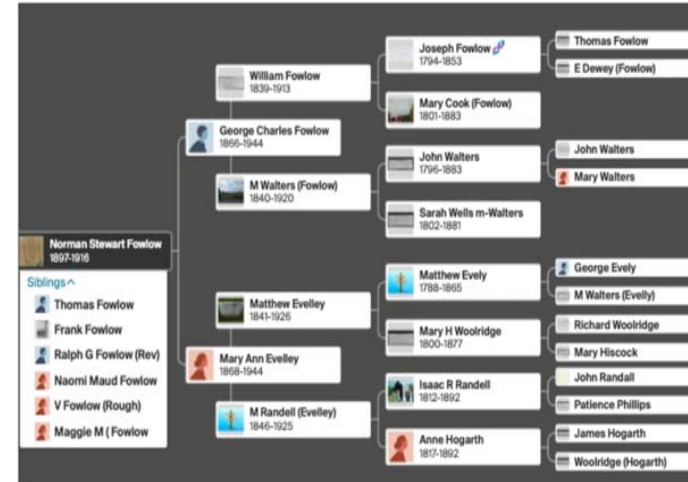

Norman Fowlow



Norman, the son of George Fowlow and Mary Ann Evelley, was born in Trinity East on January 13th, 1897. He enlisted in the 2nd Pioneer Battalion of the Canadian Expeditionary Force at Sydney Mines, NS on February 16th, 1915. He was killed on April 9th, 1916. He was 19.

Norman listed his trade at the time of his attestation as engineer. He embarked from Halifax onboard the liner SS Orduna, arriving in England on December 14th, 1916. After further training near Winchester the 2nd Pioneers embarked for France where they joined the 2nd Canadian Battalion near Ypres, Belgium, on March 10th, 1916. Norman was killed in action one month later and is buried in Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery, Belgium.
